A question is any sentence which has an interrogative form or function. In classroom settings, teacher questions are defined as instructional cues or stimuli that convey to students the content elements to be learned and directions for what they are to do and how they are to do it.

Effective questioning in the classroom is closely tied with an understanding of Bloom's Taxonomy (see Fig. 1). Bloom's Taxonomy was created in 1956 and is a classification system used to define the different levels of human cognition from the simplest to the more complex.

The Importance of Questioning in the Classroom ...

Questioning is the key means by which teachers find out what pupils already know, identify gaps in knowledge and understanding and scaffold the development of their understanding to enable them to close

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the gap between what they currently know and the learning goals. Questions are the most common form of interaction between pupils and teachers, yet research suggests that the majority are recall and comprehension - lower order questions which do not require pupils to actively process information.

Deeper questioning – asked correctly from the outset – anticipates a deeper response from students. When lesson planning, is it useful to pre-plan your key questions for the class/students by keeping in mind lesson objectives and success criteria.

Aim for direct, specific questions. During class discussions, rather than beginning with a single question that is multilayered and complex, use a sequence of questions to build depth and complexity. Essay questions on exams or paper assignments, on the other hand, often provide an appropriate opportunity to ask multi-layered questions.

Teachers sometimes structure questions specifically for the purpose of diagnosing a student's needs and for bridging a learning gap, a questioning strategy called scaffolding. The term derives from the construction industry, where scaffolding is used to support a notyet-completed building.

Recall and Process Questions. Questions can also be categorised by whether they are –recall– – requiring something to be remembered or recalled, or –process– – requiring some deeper thought and/or analysis. A simple recall question could be, –What is your mother's maiden name? . This requires the respondent to recall some information from memory, a fact.

Learning: ask open and closed questions, and use probing questioning. Relationship building: people generally respond positively if you ask about what they do or enquire about their opinions. If you do this in an affirmative way "Tell me what you like best about working here" you will help to build and maintain an open dialogue.
